Home and Garden Show Comes To Klickitat County Fairgrounds

In addition to an assortment of booths, both indoor and outdoor, the food court will feature tempting favorites to please your palate. Parking for the show will be free and located on the south side of the Joan Frey Arena with handicapped parking available.
