"If they would have asked, I'd have gone back in a heartbeat," he says with a smile.

Skip was raised in the Goldendale area. At age 16, he started working for Skeeter Theabolt at a full-service gas station, where he did mechanic work, pumped gas, fixed tires and brakes, and worked his way through high school.

After graduation, Skip earned a degree in diesel technology from Yakima Valley Community College. He was offered a job right after graduation and went to work as a mechanic for the St. Regis Lumber Co.

When he is not in the KPUD shop, Skip can be found farming and working at his home. He enjoys hunting elk and deer, and packing in after them by horseback.

Skip has been on the Klickitat County Fair board for 15 years in many different capacities, and rodeo organizer for 13 years. He is a proud member of the Cowboy Memorial.
