Discover Pass 'Free Days' for 2021

The Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission offers 11 free days each year when visitors are not required to display a Discover Pass for a day visit to a park. We hope you will take advantage of a state parks free day to get out and sample a new park or revisit an old favorite.

The Discover Pass provides a year of vehicle access to millions of acres of parks, trails, water access sites and wildlife areas on state-managed recreation lands. Free days for 2021:

- January 1: New Year's Day and State Parks' First Day Hike.
- January 18: Martin Luther King Jr. Day.
- Friday, March 19: Washington State Parks' 108th birthday.
- Saturday, April 3: A springtime free Saturday.
- Saturday, June 5: National Trails Day.
- Saturday, June 12: National Get Outdoors Day.
- Sunday, June 13: Fishing Day.
- Wednesday, August 25: National Park Service Day.
- Saturday, September 25: National Public Lands Day.
- Thursday, November 11: Veterans Day.
- Friday, November 26: An autumn free day.

Free days apply only to day use (not overnight stays or rented facilities). Free days are offered only in state parks. The Discover Pass is still required when visiting land managed by the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife and Department of Natural Resources. Sno-Park permits are still required on free days at designated Sno-Parks during the winter season.
