WUE Program Goals and Measures

Water system owners, managers, and operators work hard to provide safe and reliable drinking water to their customers. However, working to protect this natural resource is everyone's responsibility. The **Water Use Efficiency Program** was created by Washington Law, as a plan for each water system to implement water saving activities. Part of the plan requirements are to adopt customer goals. In 2016 the Board

of Commissioners approved Water Use Efficiency Goals for each community.

The **Wishram** Water System customer goal adopted for 2016-2022 is to maintain per connection consumption 3 year average of 320 gallons daily in the community. The customers are relied upon to use water responsibly. There are many ways to conserve water both inside and outside the home.

Update Wishram Water System ~ Klickitat PUD, in partnership with Klickitat County, has received a \$750,000 application for a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) to construct a new well to upgrade the Wishram water system.

The Klickitat PUD and Klickitat County have executed a sub recipient agreement that allows the Klickitat PUD to design and construct the well. Klickitat County will receive and administer the CDBG funds. The KPUD is presently working on putting a Request for Proposal (RFP) for engineering services for the design of the new well system. We expect the selection and award of the engineering services contract to be awarded during the summer of 2016 with design and construction work to begin the later part of 2016 with completion of the new well system anticipated prior to summer of 2017.
