

Klickitat PUD Celebrates the 26th Anniversary of Public Power Week

Klickitat PUD celebrates Public Power Week Sunday, October 7 through Saturday, October 13, along with more than 2,000 other electric utilities that are referred to as the public power system and collectively provide electricity on a not-for-profit basis to 45 million Americans.

“Public Power Week is a chance for Klickitat PUD to articulate why the public power formula works in communities throughout Klickitat County,” says Randy Knowles, president of the Klickitat PUD Board of Commissioners. “We are absolutely dedicated to providing top-notch service at the lowest rates possible.”

Public Power Week is a national, annual event sponsored in conjunction with the American Public Power Association in Washington, D.C. This tradition began in 1986.

“We are proud to have served Klickitat County for 74 years and to be a public power community,” Knowles says. “Our focus goes beyond serving customers. We serve the community. For us, the hard work is rewarding since our customers are our neighbors and friends.”

5 p.m. to help us celebrate Public Power Week's 26th anniversary and Klickitat PUD's 74 years in operation.

“Klickitat PUD knows how vital electricity is for our communities, and we continue to find ways to do so with special dedication to reliability, safety and the environment,” says Knowles. “We hope we can rely on the community's support of public power as an asset that is good for Klickitat County's businesses and local economy.”

Klickitat PUD was created in 1938. The utility owns the H.W. Hill Landfill Gas Power Plant, named in honor of Harold W. Hill, who served as a commissioner for 30 years. Klickitat PUD also has a 13-percent share of the White Creek Wind I Farm in Roosevelt, and

50 percent ownership of the McNary Hydroelectric Fishway Project in conjunction with Northern Wasco PUD.

Approximately 10,100 residential, 1,885 commercial and two large industrial customers make up the PUD's customer base. The service territory includes 1,339 miles of primary overhead distribution, 327 miles of primary underground distribution and 203 miles of transmission line. The PUD owns 23 substations. Also included in the business portfolio are 10 water and six wastewater systems throughout the county, owned and/or operated by Klickitat PUD.
