## **Prevent Frozen Pipes**

Frozen water pipes are inconvenient and costly to repair. There are ways to prevent frozen pipes and thaw those already frozen. Klickitat PUD Water/ Wastewater department recommends the following:

- ► Let the water run at a slow constant drip during extreme cold temperatures.
- ► Insulate all water pipes from cold, moving air and keep them dry.
- ► To thaw a frozen pipe, heat the area around the frozen part with an electric space heater, a hand-held hair dryer or a heat lamp. If this is a problem, call a plumber.

Rex Hicks hung up his hat in the meter shop for the last time in September. He was committed to serving the people of Klickitat County for the past 15 years as a meterman and substation wireman.

Rex was an electrician for 42 years. When he came to Klickitat PUD in 1999, he brought with him experience that included electrical construction, troubleshooting, maintenance, and repair and layout work. He has worked with hydraulics, servos, programmable logic controllers, back-up generation systems, computer-controlled lighting, security and fire systems.


Rex also served in the U.S. Air Force, and worked for the mill in Klickitat and the Port of Portland.

"When we hired Rex, one of the key factors was that he brought things to us that we couldn't teach him," says General Manager Jim Smith. "Those skills have contributed to the success of the meter shop and have added to our ability as a utility to provide safe and reliable service to customers.

"His shoes will be tough to fill. Not just the years of experience and the knowledge that he takes with him, but the solid, reliable person that is underneath all of that technical ability."

Since joining KPUD, Rex learned revenue metering, became the go-to guy for distribution system protection and controls, helped develop the SCADA system, and was involved in all stages of the integration of the 230-kilovolt transmission system substations. That included fiber optic and other communications systems as well.

"Early on in my career, I literally spent weeks with Rex in 230kV substations, and he was really patient with me," says Chief Engineer Ron Schultz. "Rex was good at his job, and he will be hard to replace. He made
